## **CHINATOWN**

This colourful ethnic neighbourhood is filled with national heritage conservation sites and interconnected narrow streets lined with shops. Explore the area and you'll see local craftsmen making wooden clogs or laying out herbs to dry under the blazing sun. Get a glimpse of the past at the Chinatown Heritage Centre, a three-storey shop house in which the spartan living conditions of the early Chinese immigrants are reproduced. Chinatown is also home to the 160-year old Thian Hock Kheng Temple, one of Singapore's oldest and largest, and the bustling Street Market at Pagoda Street, a treasure trove of souvenirs, calligraphy, handmade fans and more, as well as the Sri Mariamman Temple, Singapore's oldest Hindu temple and a national monument.

## LITTLE INDIA

Little India is synonymous with the scent of flower garlands and spices, and the dazzling sight of gold jewellery, colourful silk saris (traditional Indian women's garment) and polished brassware being sold at shops. This enclave is packed with interesting sights which are best discovered by foot; pop into the magnificent Sri Veeramakaliamman Temple, explore tiny provision shops at the Little India Arcade, enjoy curry and pappadums (fried thin flatbread)

served on a banana leaf at eateries like the popular Banana Leaf Apollo and Komalas, and marvel at the array of wares while shopping at Mustafa Centre, a 24-hour, six-storey complex with bargains that are hard to beat. You'll also find the Abdul Gaffoor Mosque, one of Singapore's national monuments.

## **KAMPONG GLAM**

Here, you'll find the Malay Heritage Centre, once the *Istana* (palace) of Singapore's Malay royalty, which showcases Malay history, customs and traditional dance and music performances. The most famous landmark is the Sultan Mosque, Singapore's biggest mosque, recognisable by its majestic golden dome. For a spot of shopping, head to Bussorah Mall and Arab Street for handicrafts, gorgeous batik and silk fabrics, essential oils and exquisite perfume bottles. Or wander through the many charming side streets including Haji Lane and discover some surprising finds like the White Room that boasts designer accessories and a small collection of designer labels such as Yohji Yamamoto and John Galliano. Don't forget to visit the area's many eateries and restaurants, and enjoy delicious *nasi padang* (white rice served with a selection of curried meat, seafood and vegetables) and *teh tarik* (tea with evaporated milk that's poured back and forth between a container and a glass).

## **KATONG / JOO CHIAT**

This quaint district on the Eastern part of Singapore used to be a coconut plantation, and is filled with contrasting traditional and modern elements that you're not likely to find elsewhere. You'll find colourful rows of traditional Peranakan shophouses with Art Deco architecture, which house restaurants and eateries that serve local delights and international

cuisine, as well as shops selling traditional trades such as intricately beaded clothing and footwear. Explore the streets and you'll find also famous institutions like Katong Antique House, a shop-cum-museum filled with antique Peranakan jewellery, apparel, crockery and furniture and the Eurasian Heritage Centre which offers a colourful insight into its people's culture.

The downtown Civic District is characterised by a cluster of world-class attractions within walking distance of each other, and complemented with linkages to create a single destination in itself. One of the city's most cosmopolitan areas, it contains Singapore's oldest colonial landmarks including St Andrew's Cathedral, Victoria Theatre and Concert Hall, the historic Padang, as well as the restored Fullerton Hotel (formerly the Singapore General Post Office) and the famous Merlion – Singapore's tourism icon. Also found in this area are newer landmarks like the Esplanade - Theatres on the Bay, a state-of-the-art venue for musicals, theatre productions, visual art exhibitions and orchestral performances, and 24-hour entertainment precincts such as Boat Quay, Clarke Quay and Empress Place.

## THE HEARTLANDS

In land-scarce Singapore, a large majority of the population is housed in high-rise apartment blocks built away from the city in clusters called housing estates. These suburbs, each containing lifestyle and entertainment amenities in its town centre, are known locally as heartlands. To see how locals live, head down to one of Singapore's oldest housing estates, Toa Payoh. Built more than 30 years ago, this vibrant township is home to temples, churches, Singapore's only air-conditioned

bus interchange, an impressive gathering of F&B, banking, shopping and lifestyle options and the Housing and Development Board (HDB), the government agency that has provided 80% of the population with housing and continues to do so.







## **AIRPORT SHUTTLE**

## From the Airport

MaxiCab is a scheduled airport shuttle service with flexible routing to almost all hotels within the city (excluding hotels on Sentosa and Changi Village Hotel). Any destination within the Central Business District is also catered to including MRT stations. The six-seater Mercedes MaxiCabs also have wheelchair-accessible features and generous luggage room. The service operates between 6am and 2am daily, at frequencies of 30 minutes during off-peak hours (6am – 6pm, 12.30am – 2am) and 15 minutes during peak hours (6.15pm – midnight). Bookings and payment can be made at the airport shuttle counters located at Arrival Halls of Terminals 1 and 2 as well as Budget Terminal.

## To the Airport

The MaxiCab service is available at 58 designated pick-up points, mostly hotels, to Singapore Changi Airport. Trips from these hotels operate daily between 8am to 10pm at one-hour intervals. Proceed directly to these hotels at the scheduled pick-up times. Bookings can be made with respective hotel concierges. Fares cost SGD 7 for adults and SGD 5 for children. ## **TAXIS**

Available 24 hours a day, each taxi carries a maximum of four passengers. The initial flag down meter is SGD 2.50 and covers the first kilometre, after which the fare rises at SGD 0.10 per approximately 225m covered till you reach your destination. Different taxi companies impose different booking surcharges, so check with the operator when you are making your taxi booking or with the driver before boarding. Expect to pay surcharges for Electronic Road Pricing and peak hours, and on public holidays. A surcharge may also be imposed by taxis that pick up passengers from places like Changi International Airport and the Singapore EXPO Centre.

## MRT AND NEL

Clean and modern, with stations island-wide, these passenger trains represent fast and inexpensive travel. The trains operate from 6am to midnight daily, and fares range from SGD 0.90 to SGD 1.90. Fares can be paid via a stored value card called the ez-link fare card (retailing at most MRT stations) which you can purchase for SGD 15 (consisting of a SGD 3 refundable travel deposit, SGD 5 non-refundable card cost and a minimum travel value of SGD 7). The ez-link fare card is also valid for use on public buses. The MRT ride from City Hall station to Changi Airport station takes approximately 27 minutes. ## **BUSES**

Public bus services operate between 6am and midnight daily. Fares can be paid via a stored value card called the ez-link fare card (retailing at most MRT stations) and vary between SGD 0.90 to SGD 1.80 depending on the distance travelled. The exact fare is required if you're paying by cash, so ask the bus driver about the appropriate fare to your destination if you are unsure.

#### SINGAPORE TROLLEY

Hop on the 1920s-inspired Singapore Trolley bus, which plies along the colonial, cultural and arts districts of Clarke Quay, Singapore Botanic Gardens, Orchard Road, Raffles Hotel, Chinatown, Labrador Park Tunnels and Haw Par Villa. ## **SIA HOP-ON**

A special tourist bus service that offers passengers unlimited air-conditioned rides around the city and to Sentosa Island, the SIA Hop-on plies the shopping, dining, cultural, and entertainment areas and stops at major shopping malls, hotels and landmarks. It also covers ethnic districts like Chinatown, Little India and Arab Street. Passengers may hop on and off the bus whenever they want. Buses on the city loop operate daily between 9am and 7.30pm at 30-minute intervals, and from Clarke Quay to Sentosa between 10am and 6pm. Fares are SGD 12 for adults and SGD 6 for children, and tickets can be purchased onboard. Visitors on the SIA Singapore Stopover Holiday travel for free and passengers travelling on Singapore Airlines or SilkAir pay SGD 3 for an unlimited full-day pass. # GST REFUND SCHEME

A Goods and Services Tax (GST) is levied in Singapore. Visitors can claim the GST paid on purchases before leaving the country by filling out a GST refund form. The form must be validated by Customs at Singapore Changi Airport before departure by air travel, and is not applicable for land and cruise departures. The GST refund amount is the GST less an administration fee. GST refunds can be done via two Central Refund Agencies: Global Refund (24-hour Hotline: (65) 6225 6238; www.globalrefund.com) or Premier Tax Free (24-hour Hotline: 1800 829 3733; www.premiertaxfree.com). Retailers that are not affiliates of these agencies administer their own GST refund schemes, so check with them if you can claim the tax refund before confirming your purchase.



A passenger service charge of SGD 21 should be incorporated in the air ticket (including tickets issued outside of Singapore). In some cases, the airline may absorb the service charge. If neither has been done, you may be required to pay the SGD 21 during check-in. Passengers who are in transit for less than 24 hours need not pay the service charge upon departure from Singapore.

# OTHER TAXES

An additional 10% service charge, 1% CESS (government tax) and prevailing GST (Goods and Services Tax) are charged at most F&B outlets and hotels where prices are quoted as 'nett' or '++++'.

## **TIPPING**

Tipping is prohibited at the airport and discouraged in hotels and restaurants, as a 10% service charge is already applied.

Members under the Sim Lim Square STARetailers programme are liable to pay a customer the full refund if any product is purchased above its recommended retail price.
